



TUCSON ELECTRICAL JATC

On February 25, 2020, the Tucson Electrical Joint Apprenticeship and Training Committee, approved the process of going to the four-year program as negotiated by Southern AZ NECA and IBEW Local 570. The accepted change will still maintain the standards and policies already in place requiring completion of 8,000 on the job training hours and 900 classroom hours. This change from our current five year program to the four year program increases Journeyman Wiremen and added leadership to projects. Four year completion is more enticing for recruitment of non-union electrical workers and students graduating from high school. This summer begins the four-year program transition, our instructors are passionate and committed as they close the gap for Apprentices' 900 classroom hours and ensuring their completion one year early.



On November 16, 2019 at the David G. Hollis, Outstanding Apprentice Banquet at Loews Ventana Canyon, Tucson, Arizona, over 500 people were in attendance to honor the Outstanding Apprentices throughout the State of Arizona which included Construction Trades, Utilities, Barber and

Finance. Forty Five Outstanding Apprentices from the Department of

were recognized by the Economic Security, Office of Apprenticeship in were recognized in their respective fields and honored by their sponsors for their dedication and achievement for self-discipline, hard work and study to receive the "Outstanding" rating. Brian Grusenmeyer represented Tucson Electrical JATC and IBEW Local 570.





The Tucson Electrical Joint Apprenticeship and Training Program was presented the Exemplary Program in Construction. This program became a registered apprenticeship program in the State of Arizona in 1945. The International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW) and the National Electrical Contractors Association (NECA) teamed up to sponsor the most rigorous and respected apprenticeship training program. This apprenticeship program is committed to providing enrichment opportunities for our students and educational excellence.

We have 150 apprentices from first year to fifth year learning the skills of the trade through on-the-job training assignments and five years of classroom instruction which includes: commercial, industrial and residential; to become one of the most highly trained electrical worker in today's workforce - achieving a career of a lifetime.





Southern Arizona Construction Days is one of the largest events the Tucson Electrical Joint Apprenticeship & Training Program participated in. This year, this event brought together approximately 4,000 middle and high school students from Southern Arizona. We were the

lead electrical construction hands-on training program, providing detail teaching to these students on how to measure and bend a 5-foot piece of ½" conduit into a 90-degree bend while using their weight and balance with a pipe bender. This activity went rampant throughout the Tucson Rodeo Grounds as thousands of students walked around the grounds with a piece of pipe that resembled a cane. We also introduced a simple electrical circuit hands-on project as our volunteers coached the students on how to connect the wires to a bell buzzer and a red light. Students were thrilled to hear the buzzer and see the light once the wires were connected properly. We also provided techniques on stripping wire, matching the wire to gauge on the wire stripper and connecting a wire nut for safety.
