
We currently have **3** on Book 1 and **3** on Book 2. On the Short Call Book, we have **1**.


DEATH BENEFITS

This year has been both challenging and rewarding. Twenty-one apprentices graduated from the Apprenticeship Program and were reclassified to Inside Journeyman Wireman. In June we selected forty-three 1st year apprentices, eight left the program for various reasons. Currently we have 146 Apprentices, thirty-four will graduate in 2022. Our instructors are teaching class in-person accommodating apprentices who are in quarantine via zoom.

We continue to accept applications year-round. In 2021 we received 290 applications to be considered for apprenticeship. Our deadline for August 2022 class is May 1, 2022.
