

A MESSAGE FROM THE BUSINESS MANAGER




We currently have a very good work picture for the future. With several projects starting or ramping up, we should be able to work everyone interested in working in LU 570's jurisdiction. To the Brothers and Sisters on the road, I hope you are staying safe and prosperous.

The negotiations for two Units at the Yuma Proving Grounds have finally reached the point where we are ready for a ratification vote. This negotiation has been a tough one from the get go, with little cooperation from the employers. The proposed contract will have significant wage increases with added language covering several topics. I will report the results of the ratification vote at the next regular meeting.

The Local is currently working on several political concerns including Minimum Wage, Voter Suppression Laws and the Infrastructure Bill. All three of these will impact the work picture in either a positive or negative light, depending on the end results. If we do not protect ourselves against politicians who are anti-union and anti-worker, Unions will become extinct along with decent wages and benefits for all hourly wage earners. We are working hard to protect the interest of this Local, but it is prudent for all members to also participate by contacting your elected officials to support bills that will keep our members working. If there are any questions or concerns, do not hesitate to contact the hall and speak with myself, Javier, Jimmy or Dick.

I hope everyone stays safe and the work picture continues to grow for the rest of 2021 and beyond. Keep in mind, nominations for Local 570 Officers will be in May of 2022, in less than a year. Participation by the membership makes us a stronger Local Union. I look forward to seeing everyone at the regular meetings the first Tuesday of each month.

DEATH BENEFITS

The International Office will not pay the \$6,250 death benefit to your beneficiary if you owe more than 2 months of union dues at the time of death. Local 570 will not pay the \$2,500 death benefit to your beneficiary if you owe more than \$60 to the death fund.



40TH IBEW INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION POSTPONED TO MAY 9-13, 2022

The IBEW International Convention in 2022 will be held in Chicago, IL. Local 570 members elected Scott Toot and Jimmy Ciardulli as their delegates. They will be attending the convention with Chuck Grube, Business Manager, to this event.

The 2022 convention will mark the fifth time the event has been held in the Windy City, a record matched only by St. Louis, the city where the union was founded in 1891.

The IBEW's 2nd convention in 1892 was held at the Atlantic Hotel in Chicago and hosted just 32 delegates. At the time, the National Brotherhood of Electrical Workers – Canadian locals weren't incorporated until 1899 – represented 1,600 members from 43 local unions. The 1892 convention was the first to welcome women as members and was notable for authorizing the publication of a monthly newspaper, *The Electrical Worker*.

Today, the IBEW represents 750,000 members in more than 900 local unions, and roughly 5,000 delegates and guests are expected to attend the next convention.

Members can enroll in group; Short-Term Disability (STD), Long-Term Disability (LTD) and Life Insurance with Accidental Death and Dismemberment (AD&D). Members are guaranteed approved, there are no medical tests, questions or underwriting to enroll! The coverage is completely voluntary and monthly premiums are deducted from your personal checking account.

Apprenticeship Class of 2025





July 10, 2021: Thirty-nine selected applicants were given instructions on what to expect at the bootcamp two weeks prior to the date. How to dress, bring lunch, water, sunscreen, and hydrate two weeks prior to the event. Each participant arrived ten to fifteen minutes before our 5:30 am start time. Each potential apprentice received a color-coded hardhat and placed in a group with five strangers, all with a similar goal: a career in the electrical industry—five different stations with five different construction activities.

This bootcamp included activities an apprentice will be expected to do. Climbing ladders using three points of contact, proper use of digging ditches and operation of a tamper, lifting safely as they transport construction material from one station to another, proper measuring and bending ½" conduit, setting up a tripod chain stand to thread pipe, along with expectations and commitment to the trade.



Upon completion of this six-hour strenuous and worthwhile day, all thirty-nine participants were offered a position in the Apprenticeship, and their career in the electrical field begins.
